CREATION CARE

The Square Campus will **discontinue the use of styrofoam** from our coffee ministry and for all congregational meals. It turned out to be an impractical use of time and labor. Our recycling vendor rejected much of the styrofoam as too dirty and therefore unfit for their processes.

We will be moving to a partnership with **Organicycle** (a locally owned small business) to collect organic waste for commercial composting into useful soil instead of sending it to the landfill or incinerator.

We will **continue to recycle office paper, cardboard, glass, and plastic** in the recycling bins as part of Grand Rapids' recycling program.

The Creation Care team will be **piloting the composting system** this summer by collecting waste from each of the Wednesday Night Out dinners. These events will provide us with some time to experiment with a new system of managing the waste. These meals produce a lot of waste and are a perfect opportunity to introduce the concept to the Madison community and learn from the results before we make waste collection for compost a regular part of Madison's lifestyle in the fall.
