

How did you meet?

Deb: Princess and Arnold Taylor were in a Newcomers Class with me in 2012. I was unable to be present on the day they shared their testimony. I was very disappointed to have missed hearing a story I knew would be a powerful witness to the work of God in their lives as Liberians living through violent civil war. When I expressed my disappointment, they immediately invited me to their house and said they would be happy to share their story with me. I was deeply touched by their bold and unshakable faith through incredible danger and suffering, and the amazing miracle of how Princess came to the US through Nurse Judy.

What does your discipling relationship look like?

Princess: From the day Jesus Christ brought Miss Deb in our family, we continue to grow in Christ by sharing our story of Christ's blessing and his mercy. We meet once a month to fellowship with each other. This monthly fellowship has strengthened my faith in Christ. Our children love being around Miss Deb, she reads to them, plays games with them, and takes them to the park while we adults take a nap.

Deb: From that day on, we have been meeting in each other's homes at least once a month. When we met, they had one son. Now they also have two beautiful daughters and everyone calls me Honey! I've learned to love Liberian food (except for fish heads!) I was privileged to be with them for the birth of their youngest, Zarnett, as well as when they welcomed Princess' mom to the US. Each time we are together, we praise God for bringing us into each other's lives. We pray for each other regularly.

How has this relationship helped each of you to love and follow Jesus and become more like Jesus in your attitudes and actions?

Princess: It is a blessing to have Miss Deb as my prayer partner. Miss Deb was the one who encouraged me to join the prayer ministry. Our relationship is an example of the way Christ wants us to love each other no matter the race, this is how heaven going to be. We are just so grateful to Christ for bringing Miss Deb in our family, she always available whenever we need her. Our kids love her and they know she is our adopted family. To God be the glory for bringing Miss Deb in our family.

Deb: Princess and Arnold have taught me so much about trusting Jesus, living generously and selflessly giving of themselves. They pray for my family as their own, and I for theirs.
